Fighting youth unemployment and gang violence in Ecuador



The organisations *Ser Paz* and *Fundación de las Américas para el Desarrollo (FUDELA)* are sending a joint delegation to the Football for Hope Festival. Through its programme 'A Ganar', *FUDELA* combats youth unemployment by using football as a tool for the education and motivation of young under-privileged people. An 80-hour workshop is followed by a vocational training period and internship, enabling the participants to succeed on the labour market.

Ser Paz works with members of 'pandillas' or violent youth gangs. The programme aims at encouraging gang members to move away from street violence with opportunities for entrepreneurial training and promoting peaceful co-existence among rival gangs. Its 'Paz Urbana' (Urban Peace) football tournaments have even resulted in gang members surrendering their weapons to the authorities.

Colombia

Helping children to escape a life of drugs and crime



Many children in Colombia are victims of forced relocations, landmine explosions and sexual exploitation. Families displaced by the country's violent civil conflicts end up in overcrowded and impoverished urban slums, where children have limited access to school and are faced with a high risk of falling into a life of drugs and crime.

Colombianitos, which means 'little Colombians', uses an educational programme called 'Goals for a Better Life', which promotes education through the use of football, music classes, computer labs, professional training and other activities. *Colombianitos* is a community-based organisation that currently brings hope to approximately 4,000 at-risk children. Football is used to teach children self control, decision making, values and ethics, and to give them ambition and direction.

In a nation where less than 30% of the population is educated, *Diambars* has set out to educate young people, who in turn will relay their knowledge to their friends, families and communities. *Diambars'* goal is to combine sport and education - general, technical, and professional - in a manner that instils work ethic, discipline, and confidence in the students.

Each year the Diambars Academy takes on 48 street children, providing them with a home and education for the next five years. For the organisation and its volunteers, the joy of watching these children develop their skills on and off the pitch is immeasurable.

Reconciling ethnic divisions and increasing AIDS awareness

Rwanda is still struggling with the legacy of the genocide of 1994, caused by conflict between the nation's different ethnic groups. In the search for justice and peaceful coexistence, *Espérance* reconciles the ethnic divisions of Rwanda through education and social programmes such as 'Football for Peace' and 'Anti-AIDS'.

The organisation uses football not only to reconcile differences within the population, but also to raise awareness of important issues that face young people and their communities. Football tournaments are often run in conjunction with AIDS awareness activities. Over 300 young people are trained on the football field each year and many more take part in other *Espérance* activities. Participants are not just educated; they are trained to be educators themselves.

The *FTF* not only pursues the standard objectives of an affiliated federation but, since 2005, has been determined to play an active role in social programs for the benefit of local communities and the country at large by using football as a tool for empowering people.

The *FTF* has taken the lead by developing partnerships with non-football organisations working in different sectors of society, such as the Federation for the Disabled and Mentally Handicapped. Football is being used as a tool to address issues including health, child abuse, mental and emotional stress and truancy. Even if Tahiti has never qualified for the World Cup, the *FTF* is a leader in terms of engaging with the community and selected to participate at Festival 2010.

The bitter civil war of the Nineties crippled all aspects of society in the republics of the former Yugoslavia, and the region's young people continue to be affected by their countries' recent past. In 2005, *Football Friends* was created to help this younger generation transform their lives and to help heal the fragmented societies in which they are growing up by using football to bring together young people from different sides of the ethnic divide.

In co-operation with international organisations, various municipalities and non-formal educational institutions, *Football Friends* delivers educational programmes to promote youth development. The organisation currently runs football programmes in Belgrade and Foča which have served around 650 participants since 2005.

Kick4Life (K4L) delivers a health education, HIV testing and life-skills programme in Lesotho, a country afflicted by widespread poverty and one of the world's highest rates of HIV infection. Programmes include the 'K4L Curriculum', a health education and life-skills course; the award-winning 'Test Your Team' campaign, which combines HIV education and testing with football tournaments; the 'Orphan & Vulnerable Children Scholarship Scheme', which supports disadvantaged young people through secondary school; and the 'Street Youth Initiative', a programme for 'street kids' to play football and access key support services.

The organisation socially integrates ex-child soldiers and traumatised children, and actively encourages more girls to take part in football.

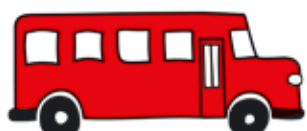

It is strongly committed to giving girls the opportunity to participate in football and has already achieved significant results. The organisation tirelessly encourages parents to let their daughters play football and has increased female participation from 10% to 30% in the last two years.

Magic Bus has reached over 30,000 children in the last nine years and currently reaches 3,500 children every year with its programmes. The organisation works with a large number of local and international partners, including foundations, corporate sponsors and governmental institutions.

Developing life skills and increasing HIV awareness in vulnerable girls and women



Moving the Goalposts Kilifi (MTGK) uses the power of football to promote athleticism and leadership among young women and girls, and to inform them about anti-discrimination, children's rights, education, health and other social issues. All activities are organised by the girls themselves and follow the principles of 'peer education'. *MTGK's* aim is to help empower young women to break out of the cycle of poverty. At present *MTGK* works with over 3,000 players in Kilifi, one of the most rural and disadvantaged communities in Kenya.

MTGK offers a range of programmes, including the 'Football, Leadership and Lifeskills Project' and the 'Coach the Coach' programme. Other projects address issues such as reproductive health and provide young women with the skills they need to set up and run their own small businesses.

Giving youth a sporting chance

For the past two decades, the *Mathare Youth Sports Association (MYSA)* has been helping young people become responsible citizens and develop healthy bodies and spirits. Its activities include providing training and organising tournaments within the 16 most deprived slums of Nairobi, Kenya's capital city. Young people are involved in leadership training, environmental clean-ups, HIV/AIDS awareness programmes, and other community service activities. *MYSA* has approximately 20,000 young participants, with over 14,000 in the football programme.

In co-operation with participating schools, *MYSA* has also devised a special curriculum for training teachers, who are encouraged to incorporate the organisation's message and methods into their school agendas.

Red Paraguaya de Partidí

Paraguay

Promoting solidarity, respect and self-esteem through a countrywide network



Lead by the *Centro para el Desarrollo de la Inteligencia (CDI)*, the Paraguayan delegation brings together young people from several different organisations that form part of the *Red Paraguaya de Partidí* (Paraguayan Partidí Network). 'Partidí' is an educational project which uses football to create a learning community among children

and young people from diverse backgrounds. With the theme 'everyone plays, everyone wins', the network promotes solidarity, respect, self-esteem, gender equality and teamwork through football while developing players' critical thinking and creative skills.

All organisations involved use the 'Fútbol Callajero' (street football) method in their programmes, which involves applying special rules and rituals to the game that promote dialogue and responsibility, very similar to the rules at the Football for Hope Festival 2010.

Saving lives by promoting landmine awareness through football



Spirit of Soccer uses football to save lives by educating communities in post-conflict regions about the dangers of landmines. Cambodia is still littered with landmines and unexploded bombs left over from the conflicts of the Seventies. Through its 'Mine Risk Education' (MRE) curriculum, children and coaches learn and spread the message about the dangers of landmines and how to avoid them. The organisation also donates footballs and distributes information to both players and coaches on coaching methods for young players and on keeping safe from explosive remnants of war.

Since 2006 over 80,000 children have received Mine Risk Education from coaches trained by *Spirit of Soccer* in football-based activities. The organisations MRE curriculum is now in high demand and the organisation recently expanded operations to Iraq.
