The construction of the first Football for Hope Centre in Khayelitsha would not have been possible without the collective efforts of the following stakeholders.

FIFA is world football's governing body. It jointly leads the Football for Hope movement and is responsible for 20 Centres for 2010, the Official Campaign of the 2010 FIFA World Cup™.

streetfootballworld is a social profit organisation that promotes positive change through football. It jointly leads the Football for Hope movement and is responsible for managing the construction and implementation of the 20 centres.

Architecture for Humanity is a charitable organisation that services communities in need. It coordinated the design and the construction of the Khayelitsha Football for Hope Centre.

arG Design is a multi-disciplinary professional practice providing a range of services across the built environment professions. It designed the Khayelitsha Football for Hope Centre.

The **City of Cape Town** jointly applied for the Khayelitsha Football for Hope Centre, donated the land on which the centre is constructed and supported the Football for Hope Centre Kick-Off.

Grassroot Soccer is a South African-based, non-profit organisation that uses football to educate young people about HIV and AIDS and empower them with the knowledge to live HIV-free. It is the Centre Host of the Khayelitsha Football for Hope Centre.

GreenFields is a leader in the construction and development of synthetic turf systems. It provided the Khayelitsha Football for Hope Centre's football artificial turf pitch.

The **Khayelitsha Development Forum** jointly applied for the Khayelitsha Football for Hope Centre and supports the implementation in the community.

SolarWorld distributes a wide range of solar lighting as well as both solar- and wind-powered products throughout the African continent. It has equipped the Khayelitsha Football for Hope Centre with photovoltaic panels and a SUN-TV set.

The **South African Football Association** engaged with Grassroot Soccer throughout the planning process for the Khayelitsha Football for Hope Centre.

Violence Prevention Through Urban Upgrading (VPUU) is a partnership between the City of Cape Town and the German Development Bank which uses social engagement and town planning as tools in fighting crime. It is developing the precinct surrounding the centre and has invested in the centre's construction.
